2. Describe the student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies etc., adopted for enhancing learning experiences?

Institution has adopted the effective student-teacher relationship by allotting mentors to each class. Their duties are as follows:

- 1. College has Class Mentorship. Every class is allotted a faculty member as Mentors. Mentor regularly interacts with the students and monitors their academic performance and attendance.
- 2. Students are counseled by the mentors, class advisors, subject faculties and HOD for improving their academic performance and attendance. Mentors and Class Advisors counsel the students regarding their performance and schedule additional lectures/practical's.
- 3. At first year level, students' academic and personal issues of concern are well looked into by the class advisor/mentors. The critical cases are handled by first year in charges. This way the students realize their responsibilities at the early stage itself.
- 4. A special arrangement also, is made available to the students to deal with psychosocial issues arising in cases like single parenting, bread earner in the family etc. For higher semesters, the mentors allocated to the students will council same group of students for three years i.e., the same set of students will be monitored and counseled till they have passed the course.
- 5. The meetings of mentorship are conducted every month, in which students meet their mentors for academic and personal issues. The students who have less attendance and who have missed their internal tests are asked to call parents for Parents' Mentor Meetings. The mentor is also responsible to provide counseling to the student and provide guidance regarding personal and academic issues. The mentor keeps track on their improvements and counsels them accordingly.
- 6. The role of the mentor is to nurture the students and guide them for any issues they are coming across. Students with personal/family problems if any are given counseling and support by a professional counselor.
- 7. Students are supported and guided both in curricular and extracurricular activities. The mentor of the class discusses with each and every student individually and supports them in all the possible ways to enrich their academic performance.
- 8. The mentors contact the parents and educate them, about their wards performance and the academic programs of the college.
- 9. Students/Parents can communicate with the mentor even after completion of their classes through call or SMS or WhatsApp group created by their mentor.
